

Do NOT Send in Salon entries with file names coded with CPI or ARI. Entries sent in with CPI or ARI will not get into the salon competition.

**You MUST use CPIS or ARIS to get images into the Salon competition. Read instructions for more information.**

## ***Salon Digital Projected Image Submission Information.***

All entries MUST be submitted via E-mail. Addresses are listed below.

Please Note: All entries are automatically entered into Class B, as this is the only class for DPI in 2009. This is for both Alteration of Reality and Pictorial Images.

Salon image submission for all of the Digital Projected Image Competitions are to be made by e-mail.

The procedures to submit images for the Pictorial Digital Projected Image competition breaks down into three steps.

Step one, prepare the image for competition: The image must not exceed 768 pixels in height and 1024 pixels in width. *(Included are procedures to use Photoshop to size and save an image for submission.)*

NO! an image 1024 pixels high by 768 pixels is not allowed. The projector system cannot display images over 768 pixels high and more than 1024 pixels wide. Images over these dimensions will be rejected by the e-mail robot and you will have to resubmit.

Step two, name the image with the proper information to identify the submission properly. *(Included on the next page are procedures used to name the image)*

Step three, attach the images to an e-mail and submit to the proper e-mail address.

***Please include your full name on the subject line along with the word SALON.***

For test DPI submissions, attach the zip file to an e-mail. Place your name in the subject. Email it to [cacca.imagetest@gmail.com](mailto:cacca.imagetest@gmail.com) NOTE: any submissions to this are not forwarded to the competition. It is for testing only, you will receive a response from the e-mail robot about the validity of the submission.

**You will receive a submission results e-mail in return.** These results are provided by a e-mail robot, any messages included in the e-mail will not be seen or read by a member of the committee. Any and all e-mail correspondence should be done with my e-mail address. E-mail [robert@brandes.net](mailto:robert@brandes.net). if you do not receive a return e-mail from me in 24 hours assume the e-mail was lost or blocked. Call and leave a message at 847-553-1479.

Results of the competition will be returned to the e-mail addressed used for the submission.

***This document describes the file naming convention for salon digital imaging competitions.***

EXAMPLE: "05~CPIS~1~John Dow~Chicago Skyline.jpg"

The "~" is used as a field separator.

In this example the first field is the "05" and it represents the Club number assigned to the club by CACCA. If the entrant is not a member of a club enter "00". The club reference is for information and recognition only. If you do not know your club number refer to "CACCA Club Number List" on the DPI web page on the CACCA Website.

The second field represents the competition code in this example "CPIS" stands for "Color pictorial images SALON" or "ARIS" that stands for "Alteration of Reality SALON". Until there become enough entries to split Color from monochrome the competitions will be combined. So even though the competition is labeled color pictorial images, monochrome images are acceptable.

The third field is the sequence number or round. In the example "1" represents the first image to be displayed for this club. Other acceptable are "2", "3" and "4" for regular competition. And the images will be displayed in the order of the numbers, in the same fashion as other club competitions.

The fourth field is the Makers Name. In this example it is "John Dow". Please put first name first and only enter first and last name, space is limited.

The fifth and last field is the Image Title. In this example it is "Chicago Skyline". This field is limited to 35 characters (including spaces) because of the program used for the judging. Any more than 35 characters will be cut to 35 to keep the program from having problems. Please make this information clear, if you are accept or receive an award this information is what will appear on the recognition information.

***Images for a standard entry could look something like this.***
